THIRTY-NINTH GENERAL ORDER RE: MADERA COUNTY SUPERIOR COURT MITIGATION OF THE SPREAD OF THE CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)

Exercising the authority granted under Government Code section 68115 and the January 18, 2022 Order ("Order") of Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the Judicial Council of California, issued in response to the January 14, 2022 request for an emergency order made by the Superior Court of Madera County ("Court"), this court HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. On order of the presiding judge, or his designee, session of this court may be held anywhere in the county, including in correctional and juvenile detention facilities, from January 23, 2022 to February 21, 2022, inclusive. (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(1));
- 2. In cases in which the original or previously extended statutory deadline otherwise would expire from January 23, 2022 to February 21, 2022, inclusive, any judge of the court may extend the time period provided in section 1382 of the Penal Code for the holding of a criminal trial by not more than 30 days. (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(10)).

Additionally, in compliance with Senate Bill 241 regarding remote appearances in civil proceedings, this court HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

3. That items 6 and 12 of this court's Thirty-First General Order, dated June 18, 2021, shall be governed by the provisions of Senate Bill 241.

THIS ORDER IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY **and** any provision of the Thirty-First

General Order not amended herein remains in effect.
